This year the CEO participants designed, manufactured, and sold t-shirts and sweatshirts for their class business. The shirts read: Adapt. Inspire. Lead. These are all attributes required to be a successful entrepreneur. The class of 2023 used their knowledge and skills they've learned growing up during a global pandemic to form ideas, problem solve, and work as a team to raise over \$6000 during the course of their class business.

They spent their days touring local businesses and learning from local business and community leaders; soaking up all of the knowledge that lives right here in Marion County. They then used this knowledge to start 4 very successful AND sustainable businesses. The high school students that I met at orientation nearly a year prior completely transformed into business professionals by April when they presented their businesses to the public at their Trade Show.








Levi is a senior at Salem High School.
